Dear Archway Scottsdale Community,

I am thrilled to announce that our afternoon carline continues to become more and more efficient each day, thanks to coordination, cooperation, and patience between all of you: our faculty, staff, students, and parents. Our first day of school started with an hour and a half afternoon carpool, the following day cut our time by 15 minutes, and yesterday we broke the one-hour mark, which is quite impressive for a community our size. Given our enrollment of 1,072 Students, that comes down to 3.35 seconds per student. While we are off to a great start, I know we can do even better. Our next goal is to break the 45-minute mark for afternoon pickup; and when we do, we will celebrate with a school-wide Otter Pop Party.

As a reminder, carline hacks for parents are the following: 1) Arrive early for morning drop off, but 2) Arrive at the designated time for afternoon pickup. Families that only have K-2 students but arrive after 3:15pm, add more congestion to our second dismissal, which is already a higher volume than our first dismissal. Additionally, it is important that all parents of 3rd - 5th Grade students arrive at their designated pickup time (3:15 p.m. M/Tu/Th/F and 2:15 p.m. W). Our scholars on the second floor do not begin dismissal until those times. Those who arrive more than 5 minutes prior to their designated dismissal will be asked to re-enter carline so that we can keep our traffic flowing safely and efficiently.

One additional hack is to coach your students. Our carline will be quickest if our students are hearing the same instructions at school and at home, which are the following. Our students are to please 1) **Exit** from your classroom as soon as your Lead Teacher dismisses you, 2) **Go** directly to the A or B Carline, depending on the green or red ticket your teacher gives you - i.e. do not go to the bathroom, get water, go to your locker, meet with friends, or visit a former teacher on the way to Carline, 3) When you arrive at Carline, **look** for your car, and if you see it, let the teacher standing next to the car know that this is your car, and 4) **Listen** for your last name and space number so that you can go there and be ready for your car when it arrives. Exit, Go, Look, and Listen - Four easy steps to improve our efficiency of carline. For parents, the main way to improve efficiency is to safely pull all the way forward as directed by faculty and staff when you are picking up your scholars. It is also immensely helpful if you could please have your nameplate placard displayed prominently and clearly on the back of your sunshade visor on the driver's side so that staff calling our scholars' names and entering their names into the Curb App can do so with maximum efficiency.

Finally, and most importantly, I want us to recommit as a community to prioritizing safety and virtue over efficiency. Moving quickly, quietly, and confidently matters, and those of us standing outside in the 100+ degree heat for the full afternoon dismissal want our carline to move efficiently more than anyone else does. That said, the most important thing is to practice the virtues so that we can preserve a calm, orderly, and patient afternoon drop-off for the safety of our scholars.


* This presentation will be the same on all three curriculum nights. If you are attending multiple nights for children in different grade levels, you only need to attend this presentation once.

Athenaeum Dismissal Policies

- Families with students who regularly attend Athenaeum, please make sure that you email your teachers by noon if your child will not be attending Athenaeum on a given day.
- If your child is attending Athenaeum, please do not arrive to pick them up any earlier than 3:30pm. Arriving before 3:30pm causes a back-up and confusion in the car pick-up lines.
- State regulations mandate that once your student has been checked into Athenaeum, you must sign them out and pick them up in the MPR. The front office staff is unable to sign your student out or release them to you from the front office. Please proceed directly to the MPR when arriving to pick up your student from Athenaeum.

- Grade 3-5 Students and younger siblings are dismissed 2:15 pm. Parents coming for second pick-up should not enter the queue until 2:10 pm.



Important Traffic Reminders



- If you are visiting the front office for any reason, such as an early morning drop-off for tutoring or bringing snacks/drinks for teachers, please ensure that you park in designated parking spots rather than at the curb or blocking other spaces in our parking lot. The red curb is designated as a fire lane, and parking there is strictly prohibited.
- Parking in a handicap spot without a designated handicap license plate or placard is not allowed at any time. These spots must remain open for those who require them.
- For half-day kindergarten pick-up, we kindly request that you
 do not arrive before 11:45 am. Early arrivals contribute to
 congestion in our parking lot, creating inconvenience for
 others entering or leaving our campus.



ACS School Policies

Reporting absences

Please communicate **all absences** to:

- The front office (email: office@archwayscottsdale.org)
- Your lead homeroom teacher and assistant teacher

Thank you for your help with keeping everyone informed!

Please be prompt when picking up your students at dismissal time!

- We do not allow front office pick up at dismissal time. All students must be picked up through the regular car line.
- Parents are granted a 30-minute window after their student's regular dismissal time to pick them
 up from school. In the event that you arrive more than 30 minutes after dismissal, a late fee of \$1
 per minute will be charged.

For after school clubs: Parents are granted a 10-minute window after their student's club
dismissal time to pick them up. In the event that you arrive more than 10 minutes late, a late fee
of \$1 per minute will be charged. Two late pickups from club dismissal will result in the student
being dropped from the club with no refund.

Students Leaving Early Procedure

We kindly request that you avoid picking up your child before the end of the school day. Important instruction continues up until dismissal, and early pickups disrupt not only your child's learning but also impact the entire classroom. Please plan appointments before or after school, or on early release Wednesdays. If you need to pick up your students for an appointment, you must inform the office before 2:00pm. More than two early pickups in a month will require a doctor's note. Thank you for your cooperation!

We do not call students out of class before parents arrive on campus. Please give yourself time to find a parking spot, come into the lobby, let us know that you are signing your student out, and give them time to get packed up before they come to the office to meet you.

Forgotten Items


After school, students are not allowed to re-enter the school after they have been picked up to retrieve forgotten books, lunchboxes, homework, etc. This policy is in place for the safety of students and also to increase the virtue of responsibility in our students.

For the security of our students and faculty, the office staff cannot leave the front office to deliver forgotten lunches, water bottles, or homework and interrupt the classroom learning environment.

While we understand there can be occasional forgotten lunch, we ask all lunches to be delivered by 10:30 am, clearly marked with name, grade and section. Additionally, parents must alert both teachers (lead & assistant) by email that a lunch has been dropped off. If your child has forgotten a water bottle or other materials, please follow the same drop-off guidelines, communicating with your child's teachers via email.



DoorDash, Uber Eats, Grubhub, and similar delivery services are not permitted to deliver for students.



Attendance Policy for Illness

A student should not come to school if any of these symptoms are present in the previous 24 hours:

- Elevated temperature of 100.0 degrees or greater. A student should be fever free for 24 hours without the use of fever reducing medications before returning to school.
- Vomiting or diarrhea

Stay Home:

- Frequent and/or productive cough
- Sore throat with swollen glands
- Undiagnosed new or untreated skin rash
- Pus-like discharge from the eyes
